

Research participants required for online only study – University of Surrey

We are researchers at the University of Surrey aiming to better understand the early development of motor ability in children with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) (and children with Developmental Coordination Disorder/ Dyspraxia) by finding out whether the motor difficulties observed in many children with ADHD are present from infancy. We are looking for parents/caregivers of children aged 8 to 16 years with a diagnosis of ADHD to take part in a study. The study will be completed online (i.e., there is no requirement for you to visit the University).

In this study, parents/caregivers will be asked to complete four online questionnaires about your child's motor and attention skills. We will also ask parents/caregivers to approach their child's teacher, where possible, for the teacher to complete one five-minute online questionnaire. You can choose to complete the questionnaire part only, or to also opt in to any of three additional sections.

Section 1: Complete four online questionnaires (five to ten minutes each)

Optional sections

Optional section 2: Upload videos of your child when they first learnt to walk via our secure server (or by recorded post if non-digital).

Optional section 3: (involving your child): Record and upload a video of your child walking and send it to us via our secure server.

You and your child might like to just take part in section 1. Your involvement in any of the optional sections would also be really appreciated.
